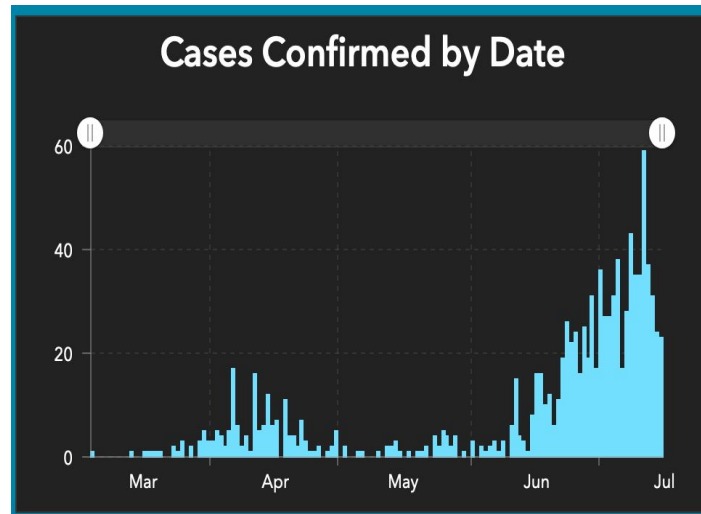
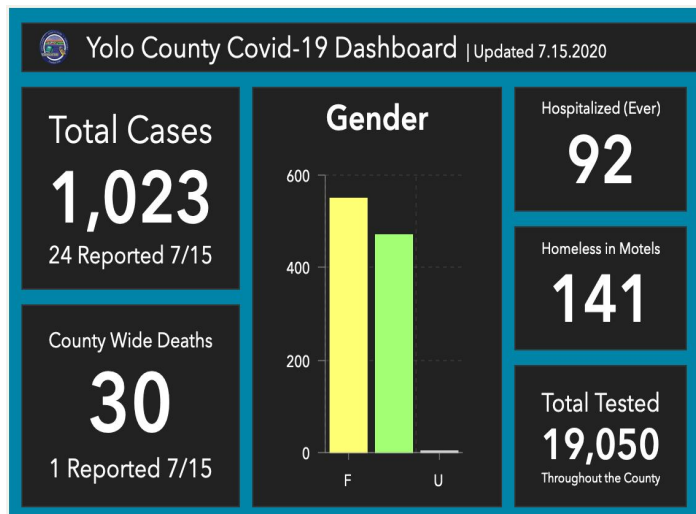

# Health Considerations

# Community Engagement

- **Superintendent Advisory** - 76 participants
- **Distance Learning Survey (April)**
  - Student -1670, Staff - 333, Family - 2903
- **Return to School Survey (June)**
  - Staff- 439 staff (309 Certificated, 130 Classified)
  - Family - 3,338 parents (5,111 students)
- **Seven Action Teams** - 200+ staff
- **DJUSD Restart Survey (July)**
  - Staff - 645 staff
  - Family - 6143 parents
- **Emails** (over 500)

# Return-to-School Models Considered

DJUSD has been developing three primary models:

- **A full, in-person model** with additional health protocols;
- **A hybrid approach** that balances in-person and some distance learning, and
- **A full-virtual (or distance) learning** offering

# DJUSD Restart Survey Results

Three key points:

1. >55% of the 645 **Staff** preferred a complete virtual opening for school
2. **Family** respondents split three ways:
  - ▶ 39% preferring hybrid,
  - ▶ 27% preferring full-in person,
  - ▶ 26% full virtual
3. Health and Safety as well as quality of academic and social-emotional well-being were primary considerations for all respondents, with childcare, work schedule or other service needs considered less often

# Recommendation

**DJUSD schools to open in a 100% Distance Learning model on August 26, with students assigned to virtual classrooms at the school they regularly attend.**

***DJUSD Phased Return to Campus Plan* to be presented at July 23 Board of Education meeting.**

**Continual review of conditions will occur in concert with our public health partners to increase or decrease physical in school attendance throughout the year.**

# How Distance Learning will Look

## **You will see changes to Distance Learning that include:**

- Increased live instruction
- Increased Social and Emotional supports
- Increased supports for students receiving Special Education and English Language services
- Improvements to student engagement
- Improved grading systems and assessment

# How Distance Learning will Look (cont.)

- Increased virtual attendance expectations and support
- Use of DJUSD's new Learning Management System, Canvas, which will replace Google Classroom and better support the Distance Learning experience
- Technology for all students in grades 3-12 as students return to campuses (more information to come)



# Continue to Support Social Emotional and Basic Needs

- Food and housing security supports and resources
- Through summer and fall, meal service for children under the age of 18 at the four sites continues
