HDT'S IMPACT TO DATE


HDT has already made a tremendous impact on UCD's campus and within the Davis community

Our key accomplishments include:

- ✓ Delivered **233,000 tests** to 50k unique individuals throughout Davis
- ✓ Collected **335 environmental samples** to detect infection in the environment
- ✓ Supplied **99,000+ masks** to Davis residents and students / faculty on campus
- ✓ Distributed **\$25,000+ in incentives** over two weeks to encourage safe behaviors
- ✓ Consistently sustain a **lower positivity rate** than Yolo County and the state of CA
