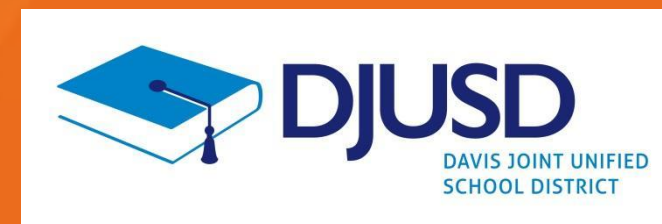

# About the Yolo-Solano Center for Teacher Credentialing

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- Regional consortium comprised of ten (10) TK-12 educational institutions, a number of private and charter schools, and University partners
- Started in 1998 and offers commission approved
  - Induction Clear Credential Programs
  - Career Technical Education Credential Program, and
  - Intern Credential Programs
- Offers and manages a number of grants
- DJUSD is the Local Education Agency

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**To prepare, support and sustain educators in an evolving educational environment through structured systems of support in order to prepare students for success in a global environment.**



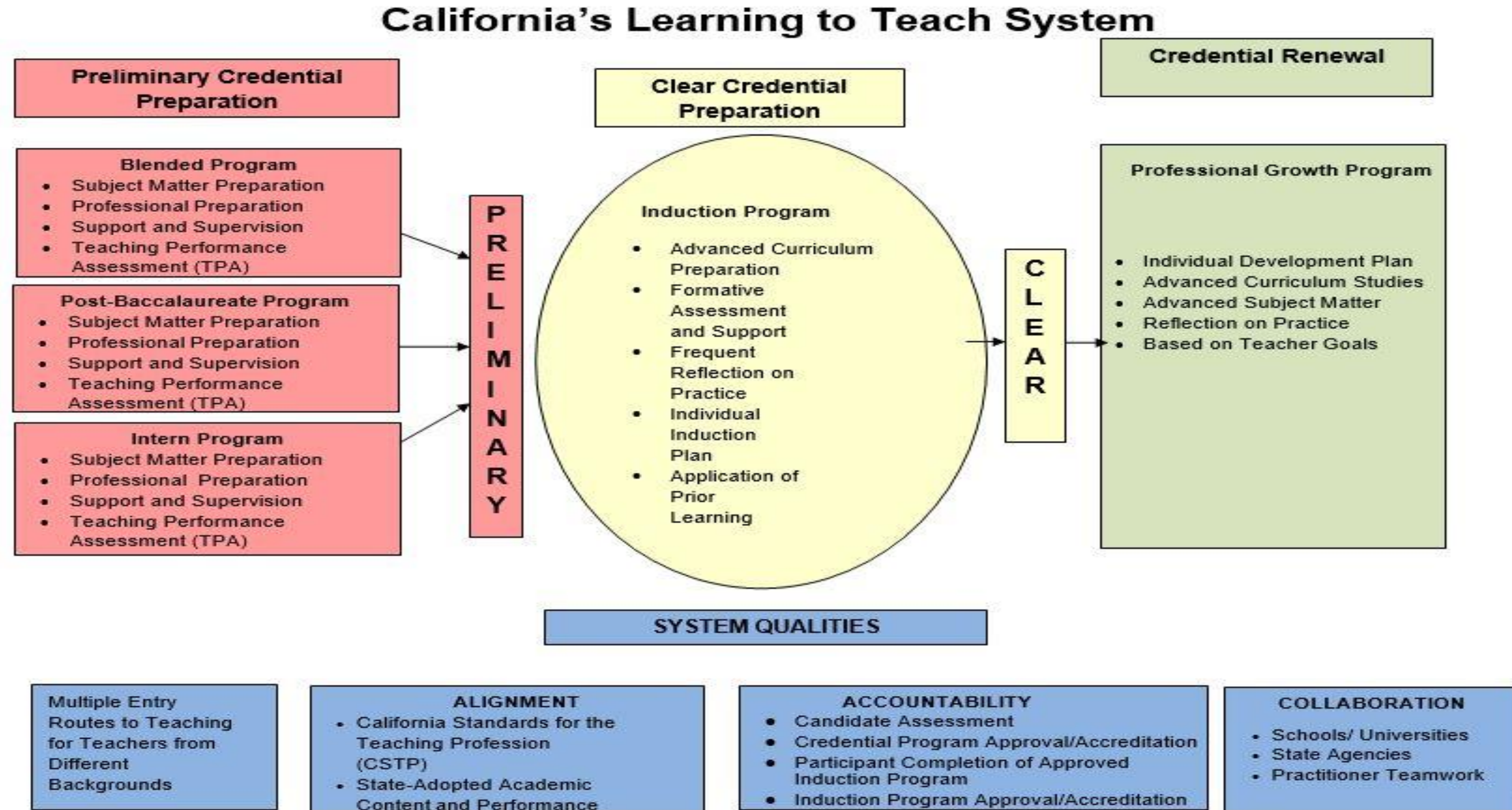
# Core Learning Outcomes

## Educators:

# Classified Employee to Teacher Grant

## \$3.5 million - Participants in Napa, Solano, Yolo, Yuba Counties

- 5-year grant
- Premise: Remove Barriers and attract quality teachers
- Serves 175 Classified Employees
- \$4,000 maximum per year
  - Tuition, Books, Tests, Fees, etc.
- Agree to teach 1 year for every year of grant assistance



After the first year, four (4) have their Preliminary Credential!

33% of participants are employees of Davis Joint Unified School District

# CalEd Grant

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## **\$107,000 - Participants in Yolo, Solano, Colusa, Yuba Counties**

- ❖ Targets: To support leadership development and strengthen retention
- ❖ 3 year grant period (2019-2022)
- ❖ \$87,000 targeted toward professional development
  - 246 school and district leaders served

# Local Solutions to the Shortage of Special Ed. Teachers Grant

**\$615,250 - Participants in Yolo, Solano, Yuba, Colusa,**

- ❖ 5 year grant period (2019-2013)
- ❖ Mirror Classified Grant Structure to remove barriers
- ❖ Targets:
  - Education Specialists
    - Mild/Mod, Mod/Severe, Early Childhood
  - DHH Program in partnership with CSU, Northridge
- ❖ Provides maximum of \$18,000 per Candidate
  - reimbursements, PD, mentors, program costs, etc.



# Teacher Residency Grant

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## \$748,782 Residency Capacity Building and Implementation

- ❖ Yolo County School Districts in Partnership with CSU Sacramento
- ❖ Target: Education Specialists in Yolo County
  - Promoting a full Inclusion model throughout the County
  - Mild/Moderate, Moderate/Severe, Early Childhood Special Ed
- ❖ Based on the medical residency model
- ❖ Provides \$16,700 per resident in tuition reimbursement

# Yolo-Solano Intern Teacher Program

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## Background:

- ❖ Collaborative venture started by Yolo County Districts
- ❖ Pre-service coursework
- ❖ Credentials offered: Mild/Moderate, Moderate/Severe, Multiple Subjects

**41% of YSCTC Pre-service candidates are employed in teaching positions this year.**

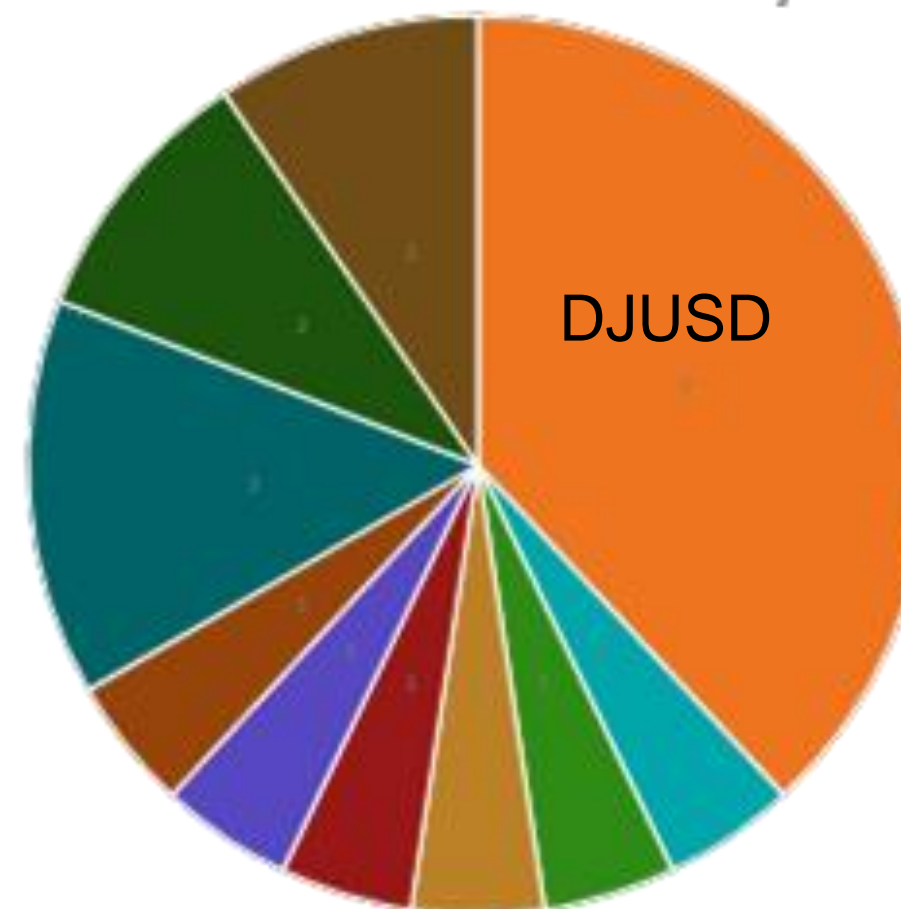

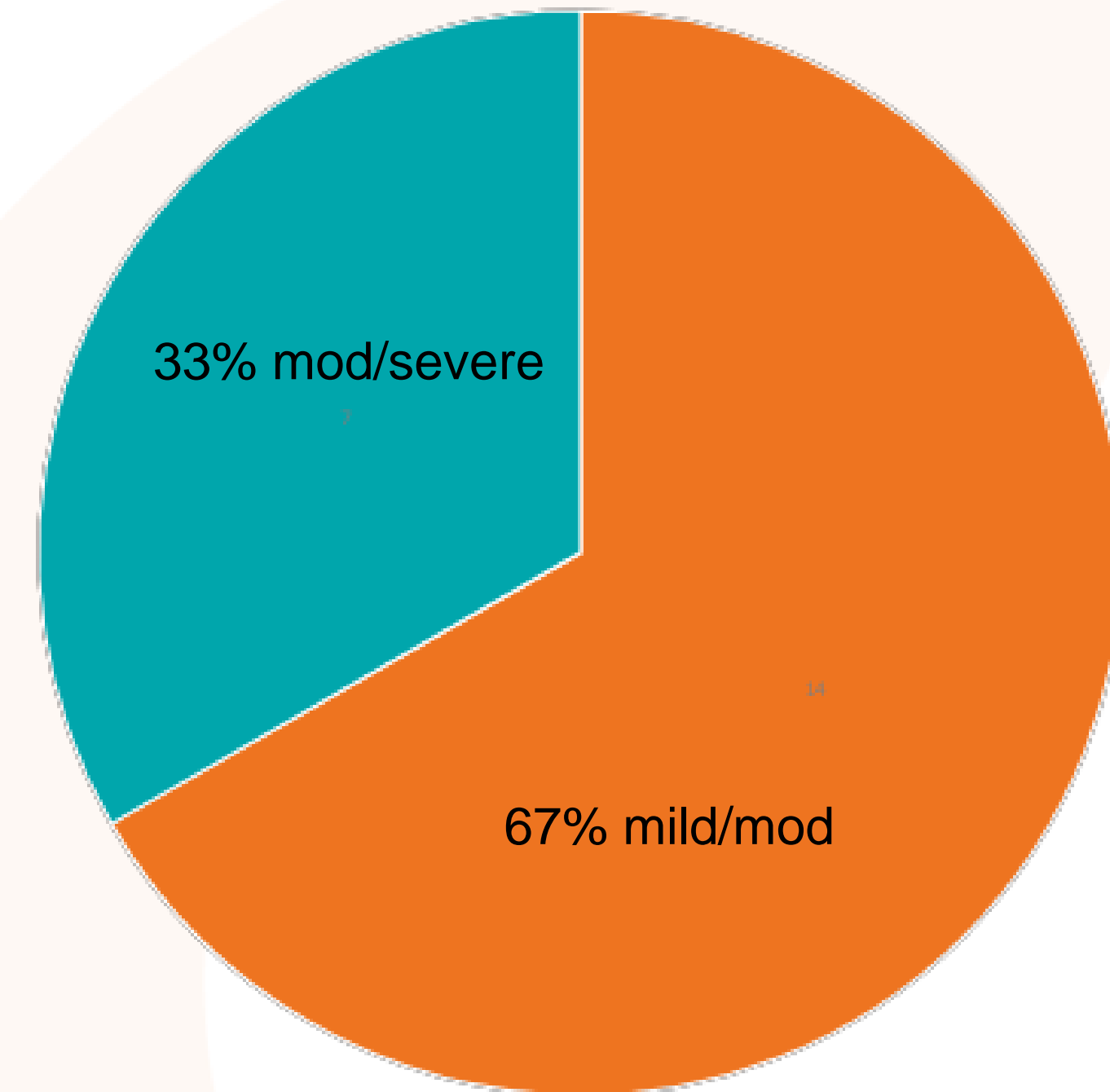

# Induction is a Statewide Program



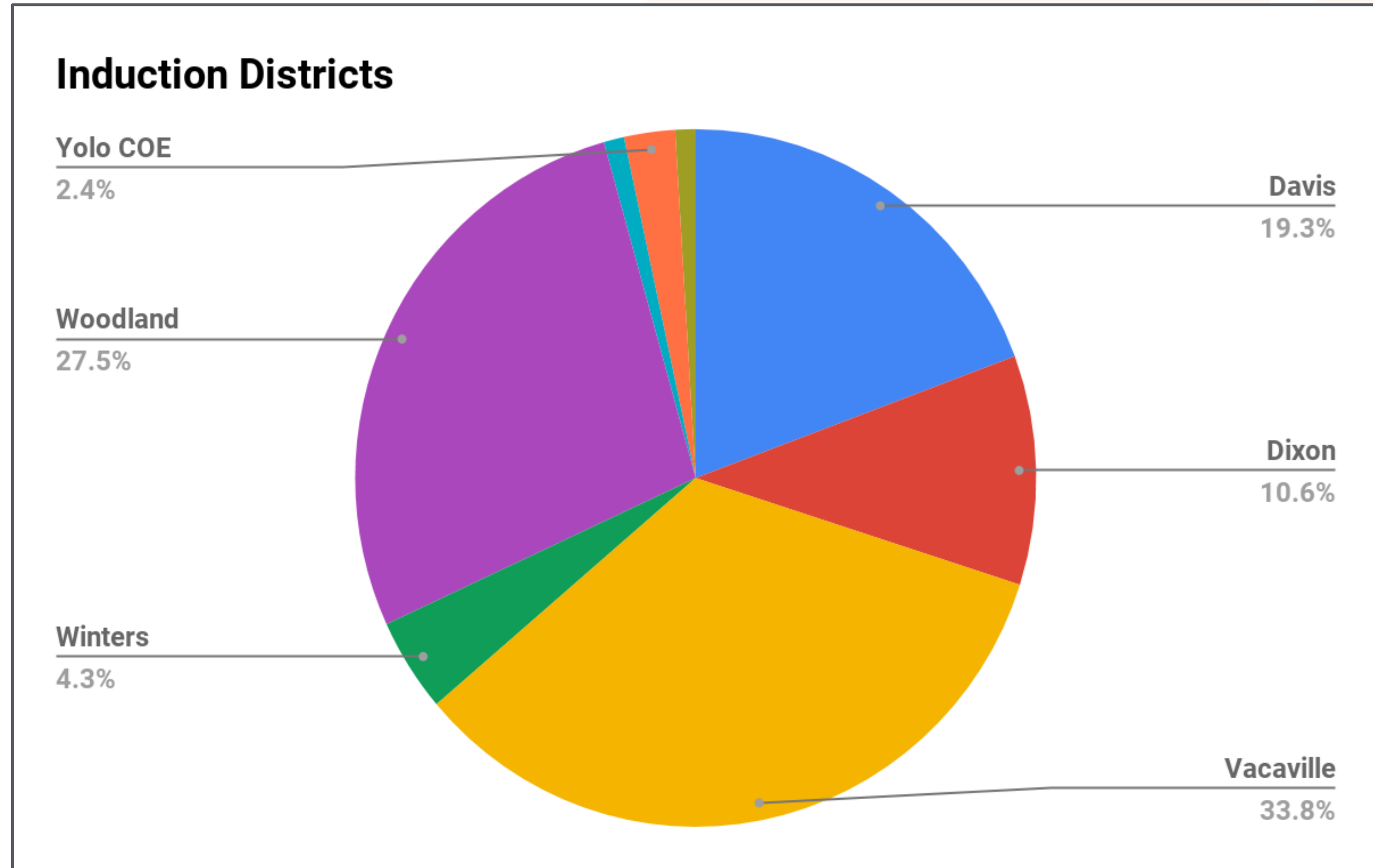
- A two-year, **individualized**, job-embedded, system of mentoring, support & professional learning that begins in the teacher's first year
- Aligned to
  - California Standards for the Teaching Profession (CSTPs)
  - State-adopted academic content standards
- Application & synthesis of knowledge and skills acquired in professional preparation
- Required route for clear credential since 1992
- 2015 Revised Induction Program Standards

## The only route to a clear teaching credential

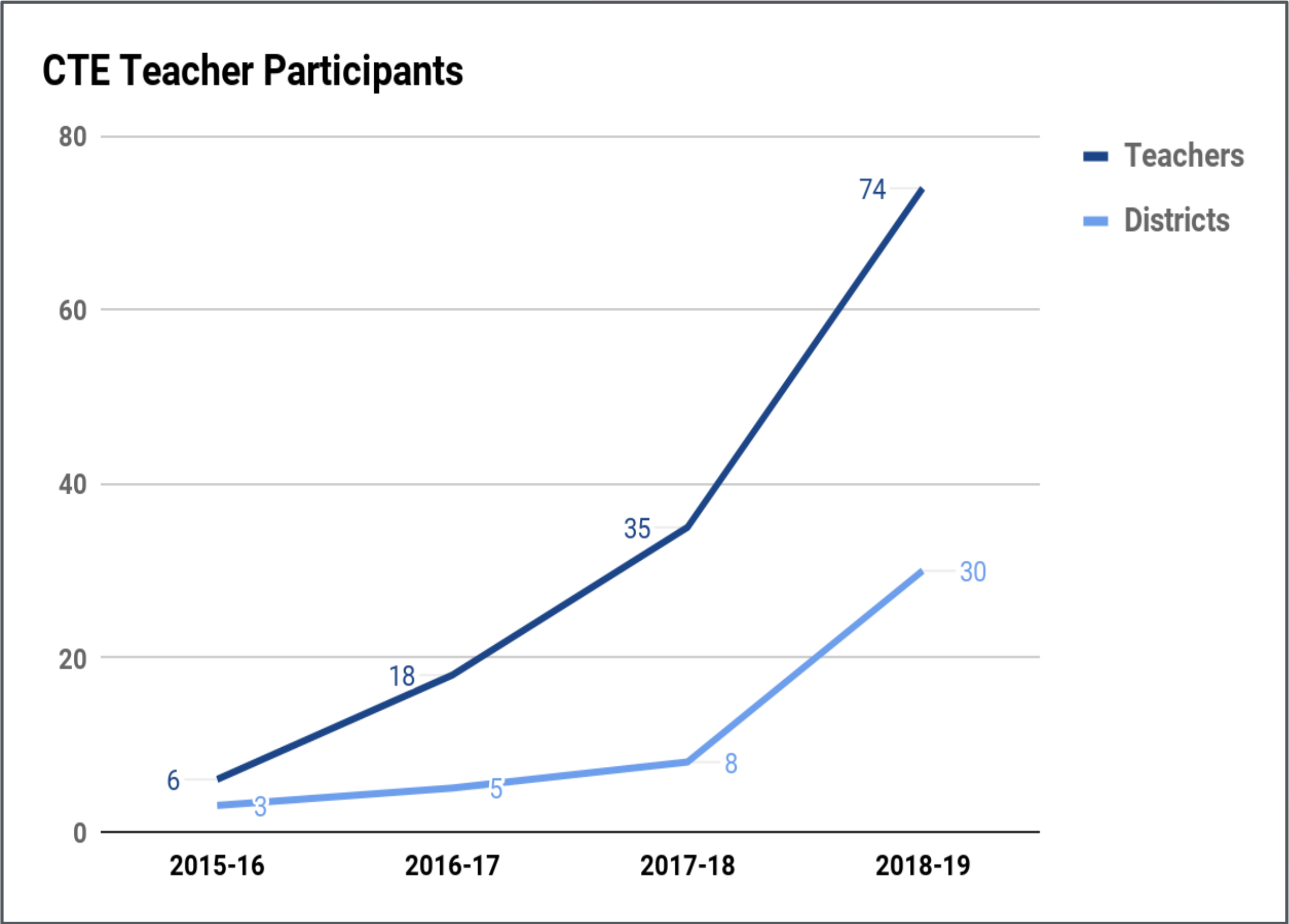
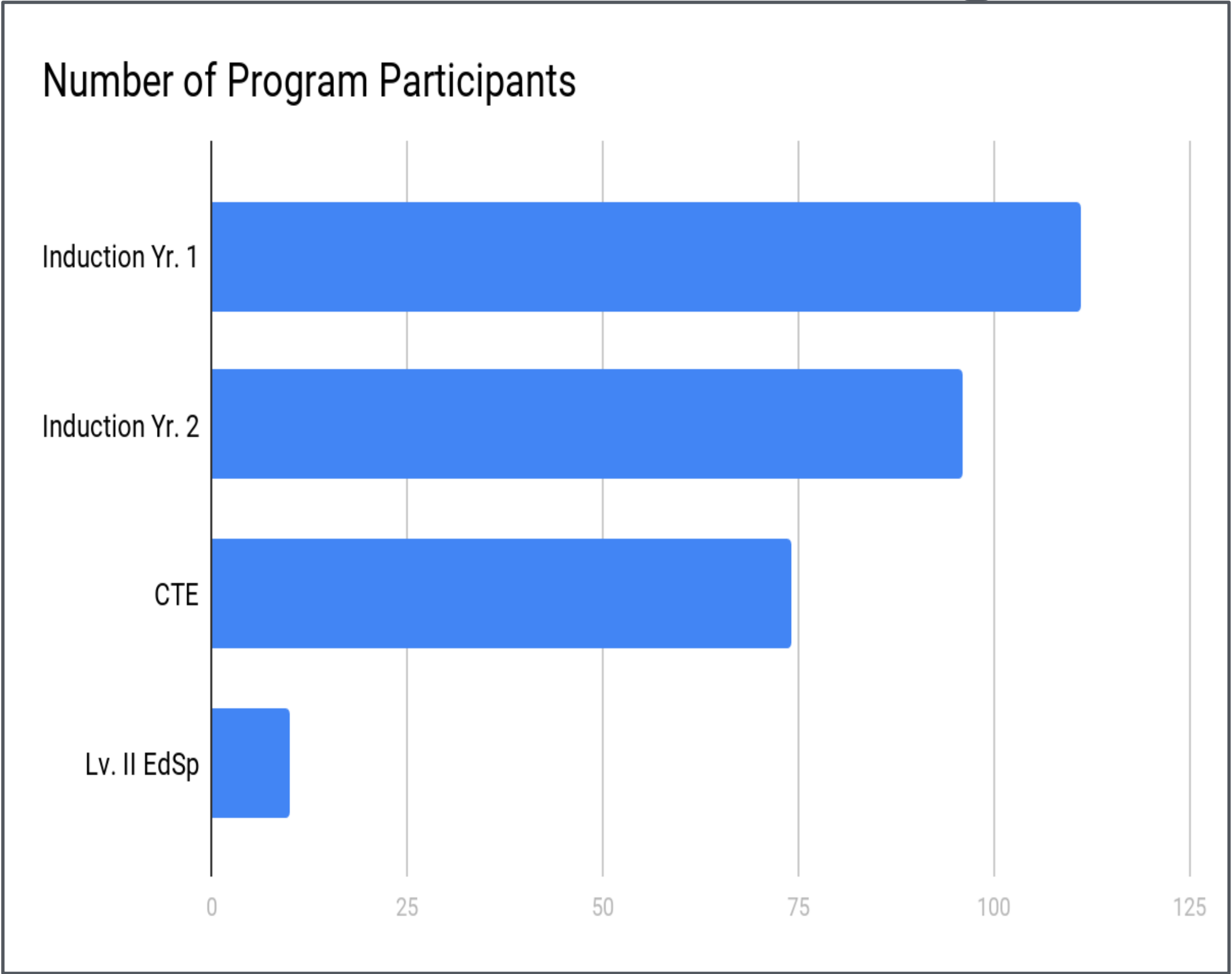
2-year Program for:

# YSCTC Program Impact on the Shortage

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- ❖ Increased job skills for Classified Staff and substitutes
- ❖ Increased number of credentialed, effective teachers in classrooms
- ❖ Increased support and preparation for teachers entering the profession
- ❖ Increased retention of quality teachers
- ❖ Development of Teacher Leaders
- ❖ Increased Professional Learning Networks across districts/counties
- ❖ Increased collaboration with local universities to impact local schools
