AGREEMENT BETWEEN
 THE BUTTE COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION/MIGRANT EDUCATION
 AND THE
 DAVIS JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

This agreement is between Davis Joint Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as "District" and the Butte County Office of Education/Migrant Education, hereinafter referred to as "BCOE."

The period covered by this agreement shall be from August 28, 2015 to June 9, 2016. The District agrees to reimburse BCOE for fifty percent (50%) of the total cost for services and training provided by the Migrant Education Advisor Program (MEAP). The program will provide bilingual advisors, planning to pursue a master's degree in counseling at Sacramento State University, or a MEAP team of a graduate student and/or undergraduate advisors. The advisors will serve as role models and provide comprehensive academic advising and career guidance services to migrant students, as well as parent education and outreach services at Davis High School twice a week for 7 hrs each day and Harper Junior High School once a week for a total of 7hrs, under the supervision of the MEAP School Counseling Specialist Veronica Ocampo, MS PPSC and on-site supervisors at Harper Jr. and Davis Sr. High Schools.

The MEAP advisor(s) will provide site services for a maximum of 20 to 25 hours per week, for a total of 37 weeks, with supervision and training not to exceed 6 hours/month, per advisor. Mileage reimbursement will be included.

Students are paid as follows:

Advisor I	(undergraduate student)	\$11.02
Advisor II	(graduate student)	\$11.52
Mentor, Level III	(graduate/field placement)	\$12.52

TOTAL COST TO THE DISTRICT IS NOT TO EXCEED \$5,732.00. Pre-approved, additional service hours will be determined by actual hours worked.

Consultant's employees are required to submit fingerprints to the Department of Justice where an employee may come into contact with students at any District site pursuant to Education Code section 45125.1. The Department of Justice will ascertain whether the employee has a pending criminal proceeding for a violent or serious felony, or has been convicted of a violent or serious felony as those terms are defined in Penal Code sections 667.5(c) and 1192.7(c), respectively. Consultant shall not permit an employee to come into contact with students until the Department of Justice has ascertained that the employee has not been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45125.1. Consultants shall provide District with a list of names of employees who may come into contact with students and must certify in writing to the District that none of its employees who may come into contact with students have been convicted of a felony as defined in Education Code section 45125.1. District may request the removal of an employee from a District site at any time. Failure to comply with any of the provisions of this section may result in termination of this Agreement.


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Provider of services (MEAP) will complete the Secondary Student Reporting Form (SSRF) and submit to onsite Supervisor and Mary Khan. BCOE agrees to submit billing and appropriate supportive documentation to the District no later than June 30, 2016.

This agreement may be amended at any time by either party upon giving a thirty-day notice and securing mutual consent. In witness whereof, the parties hereto have executed this agreement.
