Philosophy, Goals, Objectives and Comprehensive Plans

The Governing Board recognizes that the use of digital signatures promotes the convenient and efficient collection of information. The Board also realizes that careful planning is essential to ensure the successful, equitable and cost-effective implementation of technology-based systems.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop a plan to implement the collection of digital signatures in lieu of handwritten signatures on district documentation. Attention shall be given to providing orientation and equitable access to all stakeholders.
