BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF CONTRACT: This is an agreement between DJUSD and Music Festivals and Tours to plan, coordinate and escort the Davis Senior High School Advanced Treble Choir to Ireland from June 20, 2016 – June 30, 2016.

Arrangements will include all transportation, accommodations, event tickets and some meals. The trip will provide an opportunity for students to work with the Royal Irish Academy of Music, along with other performers. They will perform for audiences in several Irish venues and also tour the Queen's University, Trinity College.

Costs for the trip will be paid by donations and fund raisers.

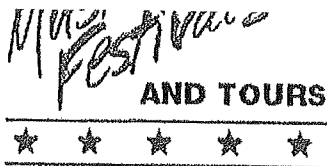

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUND POLICY:

INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP CANCELLATION

- The initial deposit is NON-REFUNDABLE
- Before January 15, 2016: Full refund with the exception of any deposits that have been paid to hotels, restaurants, special attraction admissions, transportation carrier, or tickets that have already been paid by the tour agency in your behalf that are not refundable.
- Before February 22, 2016: a \$200 per person cancellation fee plus any deposits made on participant's behalf to hotels, restaurants, special attraction admissions, transportation carrier, or tickets that are not refundable.
- Before March 28, 2016: 50% will be refunded of the per person tour cost.
- After May 9, 2016 there will be NO REFUNDS.

Refund/Cancellation Policy – our policy is very flexible and we try to work with any cases of emergencies that cause a person to cancel. A person can be substituted in place of someone who cancels up to approximately 60 days prior. We will always cooperate and return as much money as possible. 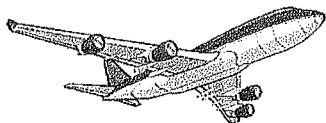

Departure for Ireland

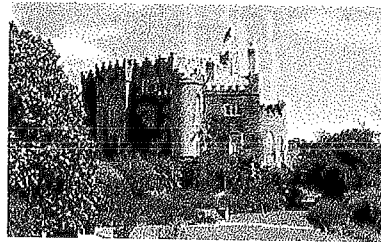
We will depart on our trans-atlantic flight from San Francisco to Dublin, Ireland this afternoon. Upon arrival at the airport, we will immediately check-in for our flight. You will need your passport at this time and upon check-in, your luggage will be tagged and checked at the counter. You will not see your luggage again until you arrive in Ireland, so be certain to have everything in your carry-on bag that you will need for the flight.



TUESDAY, JUNE 21

Arrival/Birr Castle Demesne/Limerick

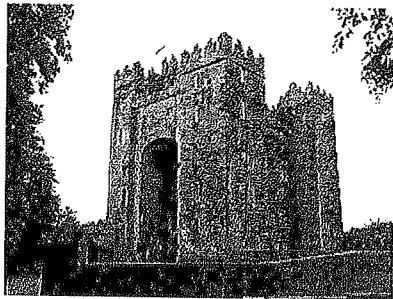
Arrive at Dublin Airport and meet your driver & guide to transfer to Limerick. Our first stop en route is a visit to **Birr Castle**. **Birr Castle Demesne** is an estate of 50 acres of parkland in the Midlands town of Birr. It is home to Birr Castle (not open to public) and its magnificent Formal Gardens, the Historic Science Centre and the Great Telescope built in the 1840's. Ireland's Historic Science Centre in the old stable block features the many pioneering achievements of the Parsons family and of other great Irish scientists in the fields of astronomy, photography, engineering and horticulture. In the grounds of the Estate you will discover the Great Telescope built by the third Earl of Rosse in the 1840's, which was the largest in the world for 70 years. Birr Castle Demesne also hosts the Formal Garden and recently restored River Garden, a parkland with thousands of rare trees and plants collected from all over the world, as well as rivers, a lake and waterfalls. The neogothic Castle is the private family home of the Parsons family and is not open to the public. There is a café and shop on site. There may be an opportunity for the Advanced Treble Choir to present an informal performance during the visit. Continue to Limerick and check-in to your hotel followed by a welcome dinner at your hotel. (D) **Clarion Hotel Limerick**



WEDNESDAY, JUNE 22

Bunratty Castle/Folk Park/Workshop/Public Performance

Breakfast at your hotel. This morning you will visit **Bunratty Castle and Folk Park**. Bunratty Castle is one of the most complete and authentic medieval castles in Ireland. Built in 1425 and plundered on many occasions, it was authentically restored in 1954 to its former medieval splendour and now contains mainly 15th and 16th century furnishings and tapestries capturing the mood and the style of the times. The castle hosts evening medieval banquets and takes the participants back to the time that the castle entertained its visitors with fine food, wine and song. Within the grounds of Bunratty Castle is **Bunratty Folk Park** where 19th century life is vividly recreated. Set on 26 acres, the impressive park features over 30 buildings in a 'living' village and rural setting. Meet and chat with the **Bean an TI** (Woman of the House) and various street characters including the **Policeman** and **School teacher**. Enjoy the tastes, scents, sights and sounds of this enchanting place as you stroll from house to house or around the charming village complete with school, post office, doctors house, hardware shop, printers and of course the pub!

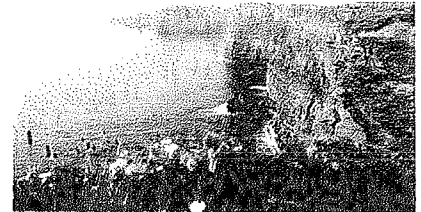

Next a possible workshop with **Nóirín Ní Riain**. Born in Limerick, Nóirín began singing at the tender age of 7 years old and is now regarded as one of Ireland's most talented sean-nós singers and writers. She studied music at University College Cork where she specialized in spiritual music. Although Nóirín is quite shy and meek her love of religious music, led her to perfect her craft by training her ears at Glenstal Abbey singing with and listening to the chanting of the Gregorian Monks. She has performed at a number of spiritual events both in Ireland and abroad and even performed at 1989's International Peace Gathering in Costa Rica where she introduced XIV Dalai Lama. Artists such as Sinead O'Connor & Actress Angelica Huston cite Nóirín as one of their heroines. She began her recording career in 1978 and still records today at both alone with her two sons under the name A.M.E.N. She plays a number of instruments in addition singing including Indian harmonium, Shruti box & Tin Whistle. **Public Performance** at a local venue in Limerick area. Return to your hotel. Dinner will be provided this evening. (B,D)

THURSDAY, JUNE 23

Limerick/Sligo/Cliffs of Moher/Galway

Breakfast and check-out of your hotel. Today you will depart Limerick for **Sligo via Clare**. En route you will visit **Cliffs of Moher**. Situated on the Atlantic Ocean and bordering the Burren region, the Cliffs of Moher are one of Ireland's most spectacular sights. Standing 230 metres above the ground at their highest point and 8km long, the Cliffs boast one of the most amazing views in Ireland. On a clear day, the Aran Islands are visible in Galway Bay as well as the valleys and hills of Connemara. The cliffs reach their highest point just north of O' Brien's Tower built by Cornelius O' Brien, a descendant of Brian Boru, to entertain his lady friends. A visit of the tower is also possible. The sweeping view across the Atlantic has recently been ranked the best 'cliff-view' on the planet by Conde Nast Traveler. The respected travel publication has voted the world-famous landmark at the top of a new chart of 'Nine Gorgeous Cliff Views That Rival The Grand Canyon'. Atlantic Edge is the exciting new interpretive centre at the Cliffs of Moher and is built into the natural landscape. The centre is a huge domed cave that contains images, exhibits, displays & experiences exploring different elements of the mighty Cliffs of Moher: Ocean, Rock, Nature and Man. The visitor centre has a restaurant, shop facilities and ample coach and car parking. A spectacular upgraded 13 km of scenic coastal pathway along the Cliffs of Moher links Doolin to Hags Head. Continue to Galway for free time at leisure in the City. Lunch on your own. This afternoon you will continue to Sligo and check-in to your hotel. Dinner will be provided this evening. (B,D) **Sligo Southern Hotel**



FRIDAY, JUNE 24

Ulster American Folk Park /Letterkenny/Public Performance

Breakfast and check-out of your hotel. This morning travel to **Omagh** to visit **Ulster American Folk Park**. Ulster American Folk Park is an outdoor museum of emigration which tells the story of millions of people who left Irish shores. Experience the adventure that takes you from the thatched cottages of Ulster, on board a full scale emigrant sailing ship, to the log cabins of the American frontier. Meet an array of costumed characters on your way with traditional crafts to show, tales to tell and food to share. A full program of special events is organized throughout the year including the annual Appalachian and Bluegrass Music Festival (first weekend in September) and the ever-popular Halloween Festival. This afternoon continue to Letterkenny / Derry, check-in to hotel and prepare for our special public performance in conjunction with the local **Cantamus Choir**. The concert will feature performances by both the **Davis High School Advanced Treble Choir and the Cantamus Choir**. Following the concert, a reception will be held where both choir members can meet and share conversation. Dinner will also be



provided this evening. (B,D) **Station House Hotel**

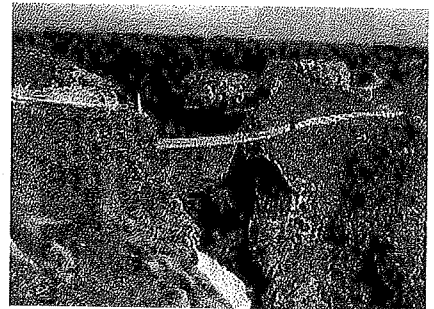

SATURDAY, JUNE 25

Giants Causeway/ Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge/Belfast

Breakfast and check-out of your hotel. Today you will make your way to Belfast via Derry & Giants Causeway. Your first stop you will visit **Giants Causeway**. Encounter Northern Ireland's favorite giant Finn McCool at the new Giants Causeway Visitor centre on the North Antrim coast which opened in the summer of 2012. According to legend, Finn McCool created the Giants Causeway by building stepping stones to Scotland to challenge the Scottish giant Benandonner! The new Visitor centre explores the major themes of mythology, geology, landscape, ecology, culture and social history based on the UNESCO World Heritage site that consists of 40,000 basalt polygonal columns formed 60 million years ago after a volcanic eruption. There are various interactive exhibits and short video presentations within five designated interpretive exhibition areas and the self guided visit will culminate with a spectacular two minutes audio-visual projection of a volcanic eruption flowing over the walls and onto the floor. Other services and facilities include a large craft and souvenir shop, Tourist Information and restaurant for lunch on your own. The walks and trails around the World Heritage Site have been upgraded, with the addition of a new accessible cliff top walk for families and people with disabilities. In 2015, Conde Nast Traveler magazine included hopping the stones of the Giant's Causeway as one of the '50 things to do in Europe before you die'. This afternoon you will travel down the North Antrim Coast to **Belfast**. En route you will visit **Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge**. Carrick-a-Rede, on the Antrim Coast, is a spectacular rope bridge, which spans a chasm, 30 metres deep and 20 metres wide. Originally a seasonal working bridge for fishermen, it connects a small island to the mainland. Its construction once consisted of a single rope handrail and widely spaced slats, which the fishermen would cross to bring ashore salmon caught off the island. The single handrail was subsequently replaced by today's two-handed railed bridge. Visitors bold enough to cross to the rocky island are rewarded with fantastic views. Facilities include a restaurant, shop and toilets. Check-in to your hotel and dinner will be provided this evening. (B,D)

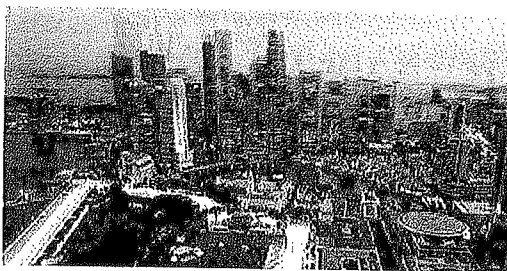

Belfast City Tour/Titanic/Public Performance

Breakfast at hotel. This morning enjoy a **Panoramic Tour of Belfast City**. Belfast is the Capital City of Northern Ireland. With a population of 300,000 approximately, it is the 2nd largest city in Ireland after Dublin. A proud city, Belfast is surrounded by green hills and it lies at the mouth of the Lagan River. The administrative capital of Northern Ireland, Belfast is an important port and industrial city as well as the site of a modern university. This morning we'll have a scheduled visit to **Queen's University** with a tour of the campus.. We'll then enjoy a Guided City Tour of Belfast. The city centre is exclusively commercial and has benefited greatly from the peace process. It is an interesting city to visit and has many interesting buildings including the City Hall - a large Renaissance building dating from the beginning of the 20th century. Belfast is a city, which was greatly affected, by the Troubles and a tour of the troubled **Falls and Shankill** road areas are a must on any visit to this city.



Few scars of its recent troubled past are to be seen in the city centre, which offers its visitors excellent shopping, cafes, Next, you will visit **Titanic Belfast**. Located in the heart of Belfast, the Titanic Belfast recreates the story of the world's most famous ship in a new iconic, six floor building right beside the historic site of the original ship's construction. Opened in April 2012, to coincide with the centenary of its launch, the self guided journey begins on entering the building's giant atrium, where the visitor is surrounded by the four 'ship's hull' shaped wings which house the Titanic Experience. As you journey through the nine large galleries of the interactive exhibition, you will uncover the true story of the Titanic, from her conception in Belfast in the early 1900's, through her construction and launch, to her famous maiden voyage and subsequent place in history. Highlights include breath taking views to the slip-ways where the Titanic was launched and the Voyage to the bottom of the sea

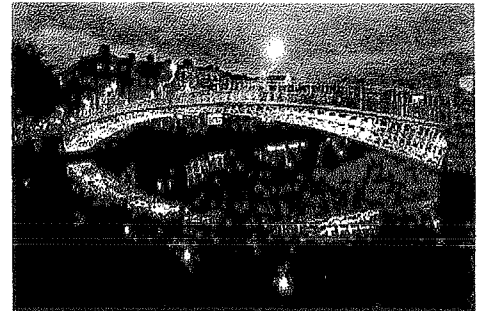

in the unique Ocean Exploration Centre with live links to contemporary undersea exploration. The centre includes restaurants to purchase lunch on your own, and the Titanic Store for a shopping experience. Disabled access to all areas including the Gallery 2 ride will be accessible. Coach drop-off at east entrance, and designated coach parking on opposite side of Queen's Road. Other aspects of the visitor attraction include a learning zone education facility, a temporary exhibition gallery and the Ocean exploration centre. Today you will also have a special public performance at St. George's Church in Belfast with the St. George's Singers. Both choirs will perform and the concert will conclude with a combined selection by both the **Davis High School Advanced Treble Choir and the St. George's Singers**. A reception will take place at the conclusion of the performance. Dinner this evening in an area restaurant. (B,D)

MONDAY, JUNE 27

Belfast/Dublin/Public Performance

Breakfast and check-out of your hotel. This morning you will depart for Dublin. Upon arrival, enjoy a short **Panoramic Tour of Dublin City**. This is the ideal introduction to "Dublin's Fair City". The tour will introduce you to the principal sites, which you may then revisit at your leisure. You will visit the elegant Georgian squares, famous for its architecture and of course its famous doors. Pass by Trinity College, with the 8th century *Book of Kells* and the long room with its 200,000 books. Pass by St Patrick's Cathedral. Built in 1192, it is one of Ireland's largest Cathedrals made famous by its former dean Jonathan Swift, author of "Gulliver's Travels." Pass by Christchurch, built by the Anglo-Norman's in 1172 to replace an earlier Church built by the Vikings in 1038. Next, the **Davis High School Advanced Treble Choir** will be scheduled for a lunchtime performance at **St. Patrick's Cathedral**. Built in honour of Ireland's patron saint, Saint Patrick's Cathedral stands adjacent to the famous well where tradition has it Saint Patrick baptized converts on his visit to Dublin. The parish church of Saint Patrick on this site was granted collegiate status in 1191, and raised to cathedral status in 1224. The present building dates from 1220. The Cathedral is today the National Cathedral of the Church of Ireland (a church of the Anglican Communion). St Patrick's is Gothic in style and its splendid interior is adorned with funeral monuments, such as The Boyle Family Memorial and the grave of Dean Jonathan Swift (author of Gulliver's Travels). Swift was dean here until his death in 1745. The Chancel has ornate stained-glass windows, and spectacular choir stalls, once used by the knights of St Patrick, adjoin the Altar. The massive west towers, houses a large peal of bells whose ringing tones are so much part of the character of Dublin. Lunch on your own. This afternoon we will check-in to your hotel, followed by a special workshop with Jeremy Jackman, one of the original members of the world famous **King's Singers**. This evening enjoy dinner with entertainment at Merry Ploughboy's Pub *or similar. (B,D) **Mespiil Hotel**



TUESDAY, JUNE 28

Trinity College/RIAM Workshop/Public Performance

Breakfast at your hotel. This morning visit **Trinity College**. Trinity was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth 1st on grounds confiscated from an Augustinian priory and is the oldest university in Ireland. The Campanile, erected in 1852, was built on what is believed to be the centre of the monastery. Built to further the education of the ruling Anglo-Irish families, restrictions were imposed to prevent Catholic from attending courses. These restrictions were not fully lifted until the 1970's. Trinity however admitted women in 1902, earlier than most British universities. Most of the main buildings off the main square were built during the Georgian period, some of which replaced older buildings. Within its walls, visitors will be able to admire Parliament Square and its 18th Century edifices. Trinity College has had many famous students such as Jonathan Swift and Samuel Beckett who later became a lecturer in French



at the university. The inter-denominational Church is very much worth a visit. Next, enjoy a **Workshop with RIAM**. (Royal Irish Academy of Music)

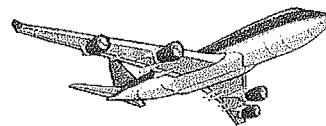

The Royal Irish Academy of Music is a home of musical excellence and dynamism, a place of teaching and learning which consistently achieves its objective of transmitting and maintaining the highest standards of performance and appreciation in all musical disciplines. As a national thirty-two county institution, the Academy embodies and reflects the traditions and heritage of Irish musicianship. This afternoon following lunch on your own, you will present an afternoon performance at the **Royal Irish Academy of Music**. Tonight enjoy a farewell dinner at your hotel. **(B,D)**
