Yolo COE is waiting on the MOU from Sutter so that we can set up our budget which includes district allocations and send out MOUs to our districts.

CDE representatives stated several times that the budget needed to directly affect the pathway and students. DJUSD is funded approximately \$150,000 year one and \$150,000 year two. 72,000 for Agriculture - Animal Science and 79,000 for Food Services Hospitality.
