Attendance is essential to school success

Chronic absence: — Just 2-3 days every month—can translate into 3rd graders unable to master reading, 6th graders failing courses and 9th graders dropping out of high school.

Low-income students: Who most depend on school for opportunities to learn, are especially harmed when they miss too much instruction.

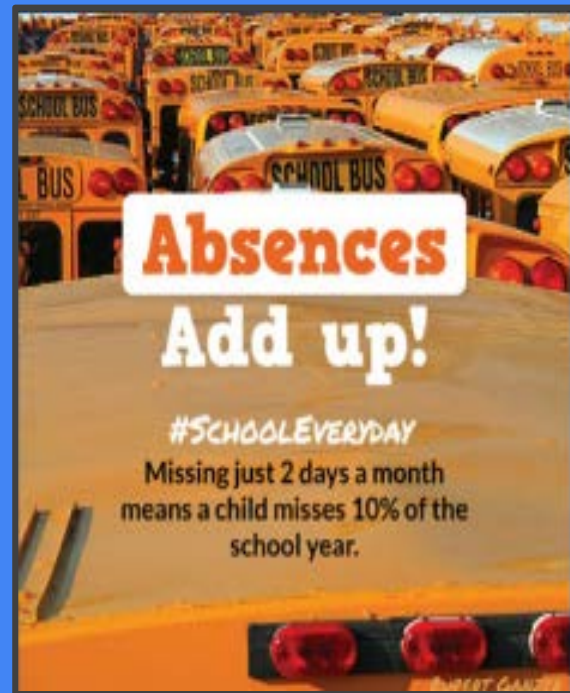

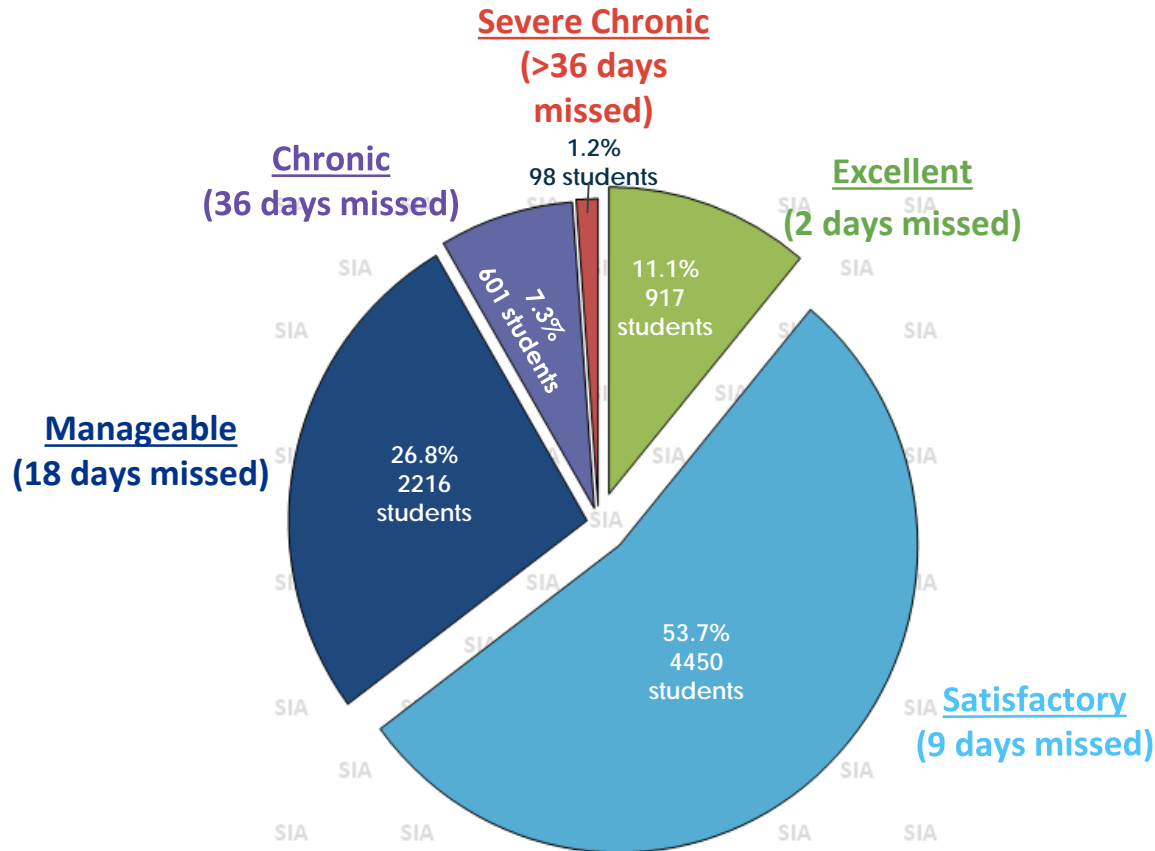
Attendance is essential to school finances

Average Daily Attendance (ADA)— Historically DJUSD has 95-96% attendance rate year-to-year

1% Increase in ADA — Provides additional \$700,000 revenue



2016-17, TOTAL ABSENCE SUMMARY



65% of students fall in the Excellent and Satisfactory category

35% (2,915 students) missed more than 9 days of school

DJUSD Attendance Goals, 2017-2018

1. **District messaging-** “Attendance Matters” campaign
2. **Increase overall attendance rate by 2%** (95% - 97%)
3. **Increase conferencing between site administration and families** (from 49% to 75%)
4. **Reduce Chronic Absence**

Too many absences—excused or unexcused—can keep students from succeeding in school and in life. How many are too many? 10% of the school year—that's 18 missed days or 2 days a month—can knock students off track.

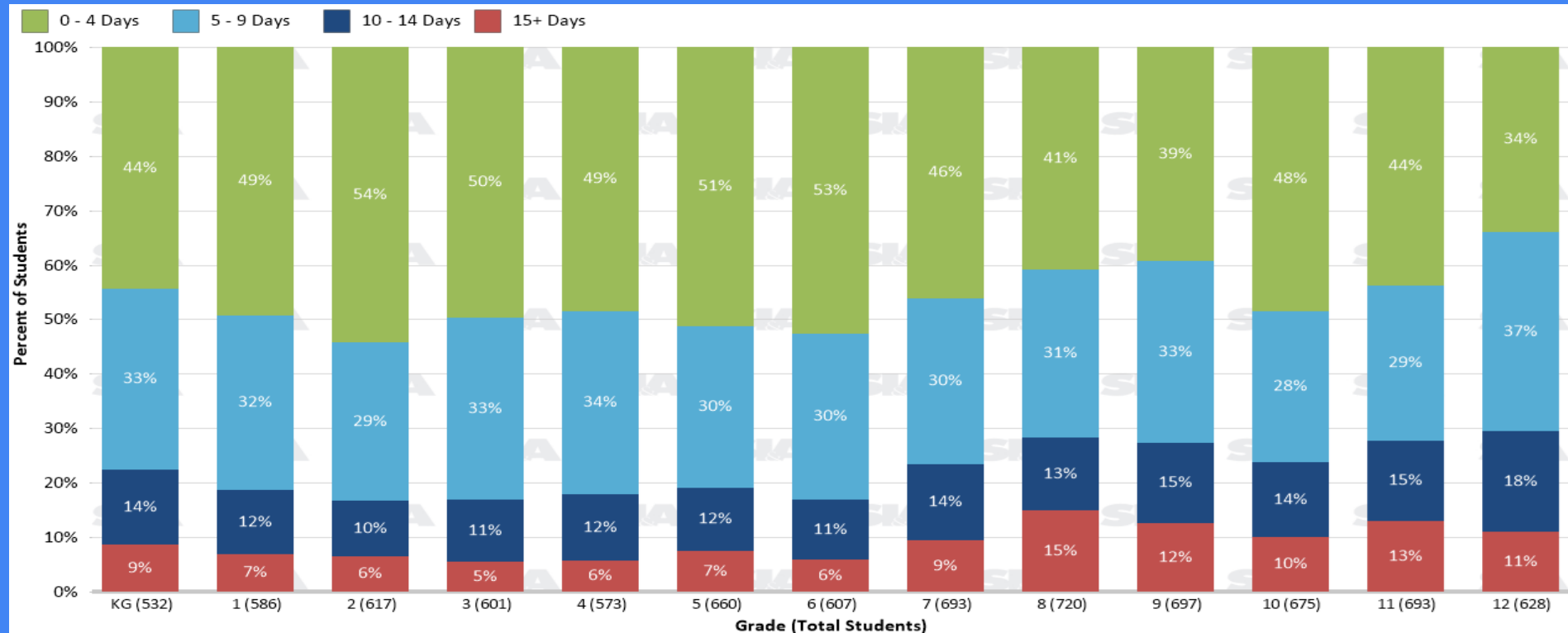

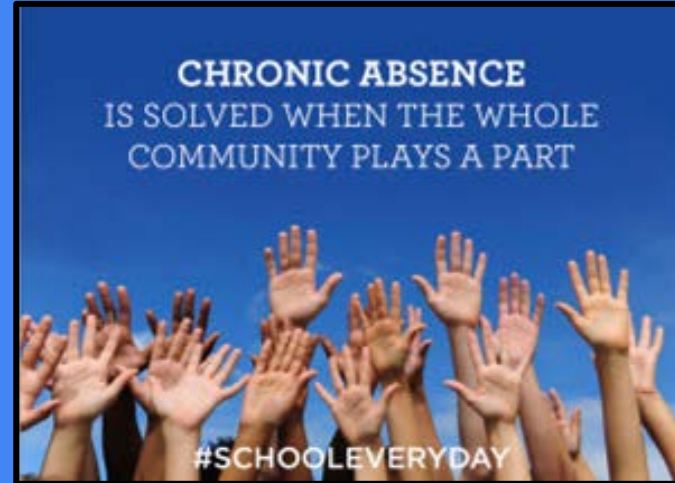
Increase Family Conferencing

- Build collaborative relationships



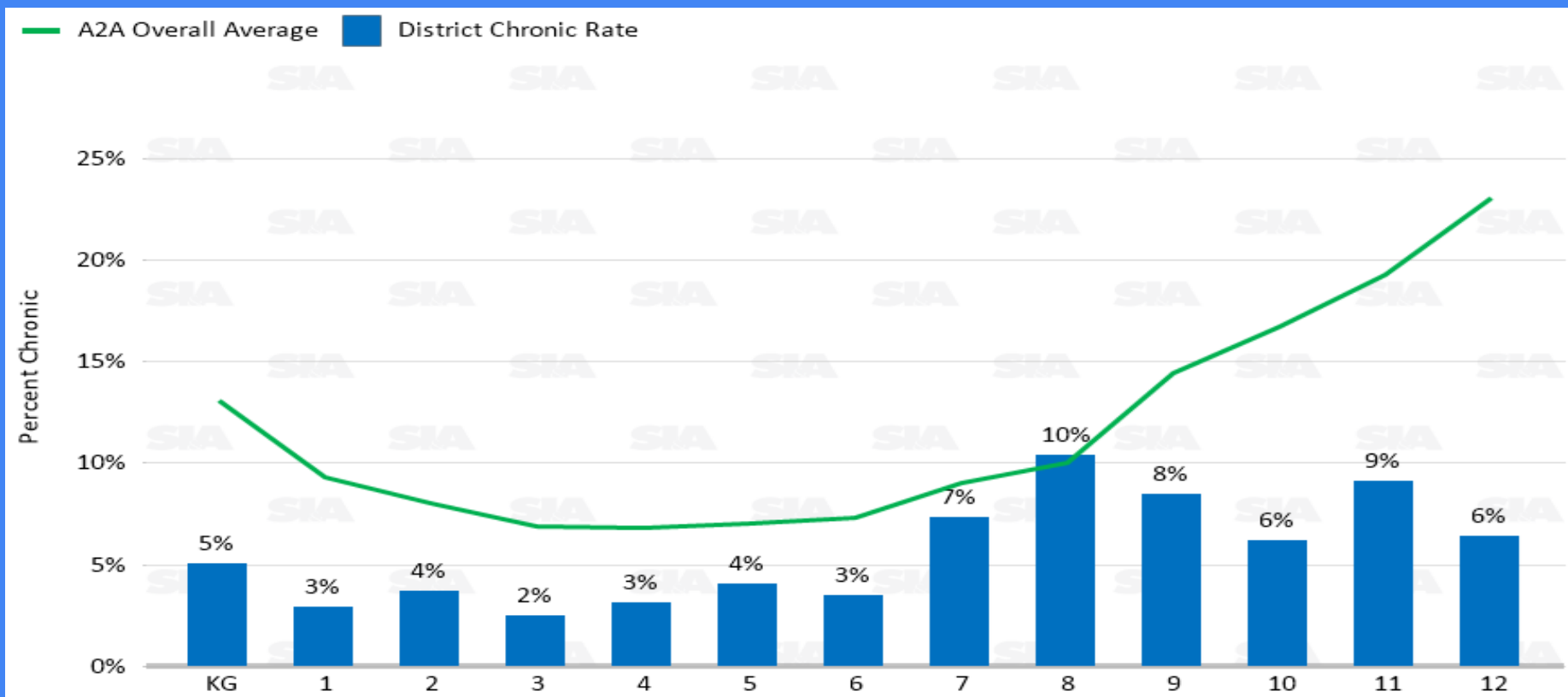

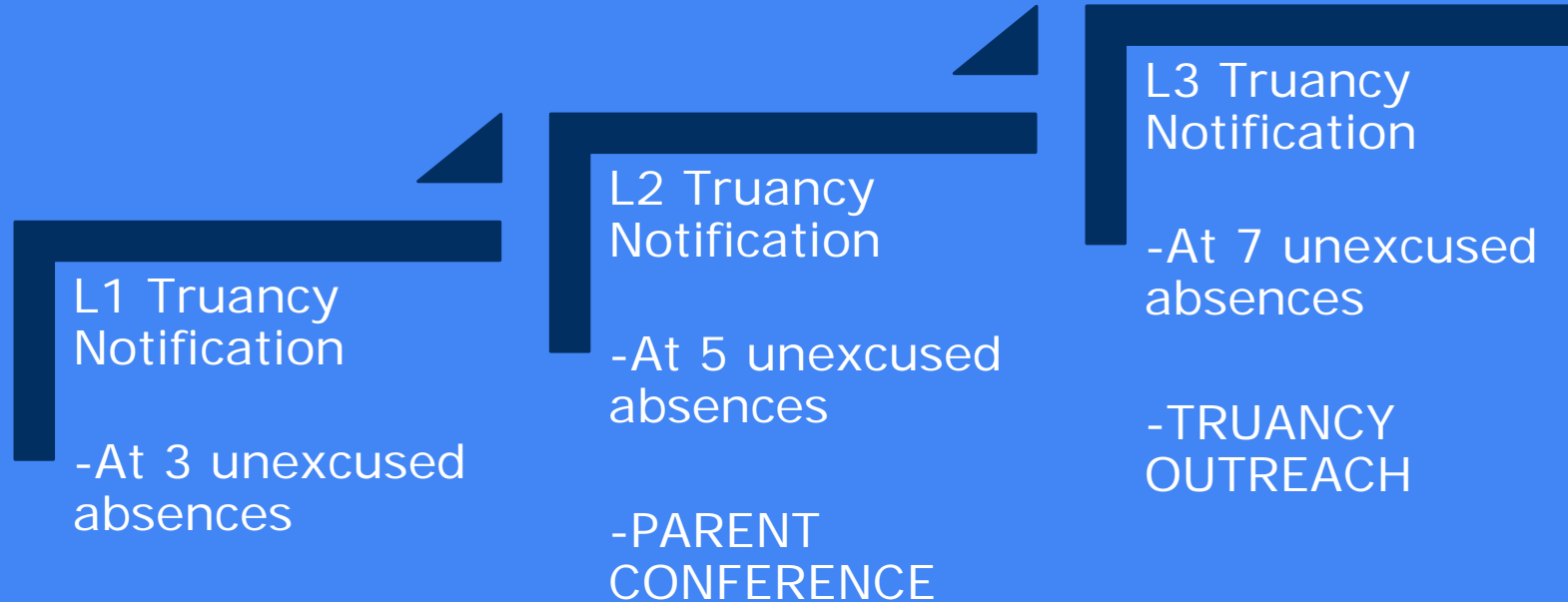

Targeting District Office efforts
