







Alcohol - Overall



Marijuana - Overall


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

- Health and safety of student is primary concern
- Interviewed and searched
- Police called if student in possession of drugs
- Intervention/school consequence determined
- Parent notified



Davis Police Department Interventions

- Davis Juvenile Restorative Justice Program
 - Collaboration between DPD and YCRC
- Citation (arrest)

- Search protocols for overnight field trips


Interquest Detection Canines

Friendly dogs trained to detect a wide variety of substances in lockers, cars, classrooms

- Marijuana/Cocaine/Heroin/Methamphetamine
- Commonly Abused Prescription Medications
- Alcoholic Beverages
- Gunpowder-based items and Firearms

- Compassion Project and/or Parent Project
- Drug/alcohol counselor (Davis High School only)

- Explore increased education opportunities for 10-12th
- Provide parent/student education opportunities

 - Parent Education night in partnership with UC Davis , ATOD Intervention Services ~ October, 2018
