Threat at Harper Junior High may lead to school closure Monday

The Davis school district may close Harper Junior High on Monday, in the wake of a threat that was received on Friday afternoon.

In a statement sent shortly after 5 p.m. Friday, Superintendent John Bowes said:

“This message is to inform you that today (Friday, March 2) Harper Junior High School received a targeted and anonymous threat via the STOPIt app. The threat claimed that there would be a school shooting at Harper Junior High School on Monday, March 5, 2018.

“As safety is the Davis Joint Unified School District’s number one priority, the Davis Police were contacted and, in conjunction with school staff, are conducting an investigation into the threat.

“Harper Junior High School and district administration are in close communication with the police as we continue to investigate over the weekend. If you have any information regarding this threat, contact the Davis Police Department — 911 for emergencies, and 530-747-5400 non-emergency line. We will be communicating again with our school community no later than Saturday at 5 p.m. about whether Harper will be closed on Monday.”

Davis police Lt. Paul Doroshov said the threat was reported to authorities at about 1 p.m. Friday, and there has been no additional information corroborating the threat.

The circumstances are similar to another incident that occurred Nov. 16 when a threat of gun violence targeting Holmes Junior High School was delivered via the STOPIt mobile phone app — which is intended for the anonymous reporting of threats, bullying and other incidents to schools and employers.

As a result, school district officials shut down the Holmes campus the following day as a precaution, and police dispatched extra patrols at other schools in the city. No suspects were identified in connection with that threat, though it remains under investigation.

Davis middle school will be closed Monday as police investigate possible threat

Harper Junior High in Davis will be closed Monday in light of a recent, anonymous threat to the campus, according to an email sent to parents Saturday afternoon by John Bowes, superintendent of the Davis Joint Unified School District.

The Davis Enterprise reported Friday that district officials were considering closing the campus Monday after the school "received a targeted and anonymous threat" through STOPit, an anonymous reporting application used by the school.

The email notes the decision was made out of "an abundance of caution and in light of the recent school shooting in Parkland, Florida, and other recent tragedies."

As of Saturday afternoon, no other Davis Joint Unified school closures are planned. District officials "fully believe" classes at Harper will continue as scheduled on Tuesday.

Since the Feb. 14 shooting in Florida, the number of threats against schools has increased nationwide.

A recent police investigation deemed threats against two Elk Grove schools "not credible." Also in the past week, a Lincoln High School student was detained following an alleged threat to shoot up the campus, and Granite Bay High School was locked down after a threatening handwritten note was found in a restroom.
