The Transformation

In the Spring of 2015, the Yolo County Office of Education (YCOE) performed an assessment of the Einstein Education Center and Midtown School. Both Einstein and Midtown were housed on the same site, but were two separate programs.

The leadership of YCOE determined the need to restructure the programs to better meet the needs of all students. In August of 2015, YCOE submitted a Substantive Change Form for Einstein Education Center.

The changes described were approved by the Accreditation Commission, and direction was given to continue with the already established six-year accreditation cycle; ending the spring of 2017.

Einstein Education Center was renamed Cesar Chavez Community School (CCCS). Midtown School was closed. Students were absorbed into Cesar Chavez Community School.



Significant Changes:

The following were the significant changes that were submitted:

1. Change of the school's name from Einstein Education Center to Cesar Chavez Community School.
2. Students on Individual Education Plans (IEPs) who were previously served by their home districts at a district designated location are now served by YCOE at both CCCS campuses.
3. Students in West Sacramento are served at a satellite classroom in West Sacramento with the same services as the Woodland site.
4. CCCS has incorporated grades 7-8 into the former 9-12 program.
5. A new position was created and titled Youth Advocate to assist with issues of gang affiliated youth.




Notable Accomplishments
