# CONTRACT NAME: AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AND DAVIS JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF CONTRACT: The History Project at UC Davis will provide professional development for DJUSD History-Social Science teachers in grades 4 through 12. DJUSD seeks to develop a new curriculum to implement the 2016 History-Social Science (HSS) Curriculum Framework. Each participating teacher will attend two seminars, one as an introduction the Framework and one for curriculum writing, and a third day of peer observation. There will be multiple offerings of each seminar, between March and June 2019.

Fiscal Impact: The \$24,900 cost is included in the approved professional development budget.

### UNIVERSITY SERVICES AGREEMENT

(Davis Joint Unified School District)

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (University), on behalf of its UC Davis College of Letters and Science and its History Project (the Facility) and DAVIS JOINT UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (Sponsor).

## RECITALS

WHEREAS, The Facility has been established and is maintained to support University's pursuit of its constitutional objectives of instruction, research, and public service; and

WHEREAS, the services of the Facility may be extended to non-University users (including, when permitted by University policy, University students, faculty, and staff requesting such services for their personal use) only when, in the sole judgment of University, such action will serve purposes consistent with University's objectives and will not adversely affect the conduct of University activities; and

WHEREAS, the services requested by Sponsor have been determined to serve purposes consistent with University objectives and their provision to Sponsor not to adversely affect the conduct of University activities; and

WHEREAS, Sponsor has determined that the services in question cannot be adequately performed by other agencies or commercial firms; and

NOW, THEREFORE, University shall furnish the following services to Sponsor.

# TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>Services</u>. The Facility shall provide professional learning programming with focus on an Introduction to the Framework, Curriculum Writing, and Facilitated Peer Observation aligned, as more fully described in "Exhibit A", attached hereto and incorporated herein. Additional work shall be performed only if authorized in advance by written amendment to this agreement executed by both parties. To the extent that any provision of Exhibit A is inconsistent with this agreement, this agreement shall take precedence.
- 2. <u>Priority of University work</u>. University work always has priority over work to be performed for non-University users.
- 3. <u>Term.</u> The term of this agreement shall be from the date of the last signature through June 30, 2019.
- 4. Payment. Fees for services by Facility shall be based upon Facility's most recent approved rates of \$100.00 to 350.00/hr. as more fully described in "Exhibit A". The total cost of services shall not exceed \$24,900.00. Facility will provide Sponsor 30 days' written notice of any proposed rate change and an option to amend or terminate the agreement. Sponsor shall pay for services within 30 days of Sponsor's receipt

- of University's invoice. Facility reserves the right to suspend performance of services if Sponsor fails to make payment in full within 60 days.
- 5. <u>Indemnification and Insurance</u>. The parties agree to defend, indemnify and hold one another harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages arising from the performance of this agreement, but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its officers, agents, students, or employees.
  - 5.1. Evidence of Insurance. Upon University's request, Sponsor shall provide University written evidence of Sponsor's insurance coverage relevant to the presence or activity of Sponsor, its officers, agents, and employees while in, on or about University property. In the event Sponsor's coverage is not acceptable to University, University shall have the right to immediately suspend services. If Sponsor fails to provide acceptable insurance within 10 days after University's written notice, University may terminate this agreement.
  - 5.2. Patent Infringement. Sponsor shall indemnify University, its agents and employees, against all liability (including costs and expenses incurred) for use of any invention or discovery and for the infringement of any Letter Patent (not including liability arising pursuant to U.S. Code section 183, Title 35 (1952) prior to the issuance of Letters Patent) occurring during the performance of this agreement and resulting from Sponsor's request or instruction that the Facility utilize any device, method, or technique not normally utilized by the Facility.

# 6. Non-Liability of University.

- 6.1. <u>Consequential Damages</u>. University shall not be liable for any loss of profits, claims against Sponsor by any third party, or consequential damages.
- 6.2. <u>Delay/Desired Result</u>. University shall incur no liability to Sponsor or to any third party for any loss, cost, claim or damage, either direct or consequential, arising from University's delay in performance or failure to perform services, or failure to achieve a desired result.
- 6.3. <u>Property Damage</u>. University shall incur no liability to Sponsor or to any third party for loss or destruction of or damage to any materials to be sampled, assayed, or tested, data, equipment, or other property brought upon University premises by Sponsor or delivered to University by Sponsor in connection with this agreement. Sponsor accepts all liability for risk of loss to any and all such property.
- 6.4. <u>Liability Limitation</u>. University's liability for damages shall not exceed the total of all charges paid by Sponsor.
- 7. <u>Confidential Information</u>. During the course of this agreement, Sponsor may provide University with information, data, or material that it regards as proprietary or confidential. Such information shall be marked or stamped "CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION". If communicated orally to University, Sponsor shall submit confirmation in writing within five days of such disclosure.

- 7.1. <u>University's Obligation</u>. University shall treat Sponsor's Confidential Information in the same manner as University treats its own similar information. Upon Sponsor's written request, University shall use reasonable means to protect Sponsor's Confidential Information by means not normally employed by University, however, University shall have no obligation to comply with any such request by Sponsor. Should such protection occur, any related costs shall be borne by Sponsor. University shall not be liable for inadvertent disclosure of Confidential Information provided University has exercised reasonable care.
- 7.2. Exempt Information. Confidential Information does not include information that is (i) not exempt from disclosure under the California Public Records Act (Calif. Gov. Code sec. 6250 et seq.); (ii) otherwise available to the public; (iii) rightfully received from a third party not in breach of an obligation of confidentiality; (iv) independently developed by University; (v) previously known to University; or (vi) produced in compliance with a court order or when required by law. University shall give reasonable notice to Sponsor that Confidential Information is being sought by a third party, to afford Sponsor an opportunity to limit or prevent disclosure. Any defense against disclosure shall be at Sponsor's sole initiative, risk, cost, and expense. University is not obligated to participate in any defense against such request for disclosure. Upon Sponsor's request, University agrees to cease using all Confidential Information and to return it promptly to Sponsor.
- 7.3. <u>Time Limitation</u>. University shall not divulge Sponsor's Confidential Information for a period of three years following termination of this agreement, or earlier if Sponsor makes or allows its Confidential Information to become public knowledge, or by communicating such Confidential Information to a party not bound by an obligation of confidentiality.
- 7.4. <u>Disposition of Confidential Information</u>. Upon completion of services or termination of this agreement, by Sponsor's written request, University shall return any Confidential Information. Absent such request, Facility shall destroy or dispose of it according to its established procedures.
- 8. <u>Disclaimer of Warranty</u>. UNIVERSITY MAKES NO WARRANTY AS TO RESULTS TO BE OBTAINED BY SPONSOR FROM THE USE OF ANY SERVICES AND/OR FACILITIES PROVIDED BY UNIVERSITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT. THERE ARE NO EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.
- 9. Shipment of Restricted Materials. In the event that Sponsor will be providing materials to be sampled, assayed, or used by University in providing Services hereunder whose shipment would require authorization or permits from governmental authorities (including return of any such materials to Sponsor following completion of Services or termination of this agreement), application for such authorization or permit shall be solely at Sponsor's initiative, risk, cost, and expense.
- 10. <u>University's Right to Use Data</u>. University shall have the unrestricted right to use for its own purposes, including publication, any data or information which it may develop in

connection with or as a result of performing the services described in Exhibit A. Upon written request, University agrees to submit a copy of any proposed publication to Sponsor and allow Sponsor a 30 day period in which to review each publication for confidentiality purposes and to identify any inadvertent disclosures of Sponsor's Confidential Information. If necessary to permit the preparation and filing of United States patent applications, University may agree, in its sole discretion, to an additional delay period not exceeding 30 days.

- 11. <u>Use of University's Name</u>. Sponsor shall not use the name or mark of University in any form or manner in advertisements, reports, or other information released to the public without the prior written approval of University.
- 12. <u>Termination</u>. University may terminate this agreement at any time by giving Sponsor 30 calendar days' written notice of such action.
- 13. Notices. Notices shall be directed to the appropriate parties at the following addresses:

- 15. <u>Relationship of the Parties</u>. The parties to this agreement shall be and remain at all times independent contractors, neither being the employee, agent, representative, or sponsor of the other in their relationship under this agreement.
- 16. Governing Law. This agreement shall be construed pursuant to California law.
- 17. <u>Amendment</u>. No change in any term or condition of this agreement shall become effective unless by amendment in writing signed by both parties.

- 18. Severability. If a provision of this agreement becomes, or is determined to be, illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, that will not affect the legality, validity, or enforceability of any other provision of the agreement or of any portion of the invalidated provision remains legal, valid, or enforceable.
- 19. Entire Agreement. The terms of Sponsor's addendum or purchase order shall have no effect on the terms and conditions of this agreement. This agreement contains all of the terms and conditions applicable to the Services provided hereunder and constitutes the entire understanding of the parties respecting the subject matter hereof, superseding any prior understanding or agreement between them, written or oral, regarding the same subject matter.

# Proposal History-Social Science Professional Learning for Davis Joint Unified School District



2018-2019 Academic Year

**Background:** Davis Joint Unified School District (DJUSD) seeks professional learning programming to assist their Grades 4 through 12 social science teachers in implementing the 2016 History-Social Science (HSS) Curriculum Framework.

#### Services

To meet the needs of DJUSD, the History Project at UC Davis (HP) proposes the following program:

# Introduction to the Framework through New Instructional Materials.

Introduction to the Framework – 1 Day Seminar

- Updates to the new HSS Framework
- A focused exploration of the four shifts (inquiry and disciplinary thinking, updated content, academic literacy, and citizenship).
- Explanation of the updated history content including the FAIR Act and resources to support instruction on the FAIR Act (as appropriate/relevant for each grade).
- Examination of how to use inquiry to frame instruction and the key components of an inquiry-based lesson with model strategies to support historical analysis. This section will highlight how to bring in diverse perspectives.
- Support and strategies for developing students' academic literacy skills aligned to the CCSS and ELD standards, focused on reading comprehension. The session for Intermediate Grades will include analysis of how to integrate with their ELA Benchmark Curriculum.
- Focused discussion on supporting civic and cultural awareness for district's Graduate Student Profile through HSS instruction. Junior High School Teachers will also receive focused support for addressing the Communication aspect of the Profile.

Cost:  $$350/hour \times 6 \text{ hours per day} = $2,100$ 

Six days x \$2,100/day = \$12,600

Two days 4-6 (teachers choose 1)

One day 7-9: Framework, shifts, FAIR, Strategies

One day (broken into 2 hour blocks 7-9) Content

Two Days 10-12 (broken into 2 groups)

## Curriculum Writing – 1 Day Workshop

- Based on a pre-administered survey, the HP will prepare resource sets aligned to the topics in the survey for teachers to use at the curriculum writing day.
- <u>Introduction to cascading questions and practice to develop high-quality inquiry questions to guide</u> instruction for each grade level and source set.
- Introduction and discussion of lesson plan templates for inquiry-based instruction.
- Exploration of grade-appropriate strategy toolbox to incorporate into lesson plans
- Facilitated time to develop lesson plan drafts.
- Primary teachers will also receive support for alignment with their Benchmark Curriculum.

Cost:  $$350/hour \times 6 \text{ hours per day} = $2,100$ 

Five days x \$2,100/day = \$10,500

Breaking 4-6 and HS into 2 days (due to challenges arranging for subs)

#### Facilitated Peer Observation

- Support for identifying the model teachers to observe.
- Provide feedback for model teachers' instruction as needed.
- Introduction of observation protocols.
- Observation of model teaching.
- Facilitated discussion following observations.

Cost:  $$100/hour \times 6 /hours per day = $600$ Three days (one per grade-band)  $\times $600 = $1,800$
